

Planting

RAMSA's proposed planting design builds from the goals outlined by the Audubon Society in order to create a built environment that integrates seamlessly with its beautiful, natural surroundings. This harmony of planting will create a serene environment that will seem to have arisen organically over time using primarily native or naturalized tree and shrub species, the planting scheme will result in low water consumption. Drought-resistant turf will be specified where possible. The golf course will be treated in a more naturalistic fashion than it is currently; while the greens must be maintained in a pristine state. The "rough" and any intestinal areas will de-emphasized turf planting and will introduce more native understory, shrub and groundcover plantings. Retention basins which are crucial to the overall site storm drainage scheme will be planted with native grasses and other hydric species in order to integrate them visually and functionally into the surrounding environment. Planting will also be used to screen and protect sensitive view corridors. The proposed species were chosen for year-round interest including flowering trees and shrubs and evergreens.
